



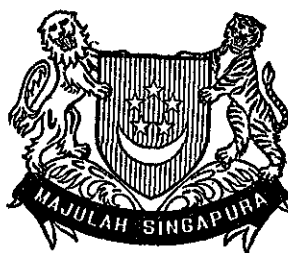
LETTER OF AUTHORITY

I, S. Rajaratnam, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Republic of Singapore, hereby grant unto H.E. Datuk Ali bin Abdullah, Secretary-General of the ASEAN Secretariat full power and authority to sign on my behalf separate agreements with Singapore-Japan Merchant Bank of the Republic of Singapore and Bumiputra Merchant Bankers Berhad of Malaysia respectively, the text of such agreements as in Annexure A hereto, and generally to do and perform all such acts and things necessary for the implementation and performance of the said agreements including the grants of power of attorney to the said banks on the terms as contained in Annexure B hereto. I hereby also ratify and confirm all and whatsoever the said H.E. Datuk Ali bin Abdullah, Secretary-General of the ASEAN Secretariat has done which is not inconsistent with the aforesaid power and authority.
