MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

THE GOVERNMENT OF HIS MAJESTY THE SULTAN AND YANG DIPERTUAN OF NEGARA BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF MALAYSIA

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SINGAPORE

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND

ON

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE ASEAN OPTICAL FIBRE SUBMARINE CABLE NETWORK

The Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Dipertuan of Negara Brunei Darussalam (hereinafter called "Brunei Darussalam"), the Government of the Republic of Indonesia (hereinafter called "Indonesia"), the Government of Malaysia (hereinafter called "Malaysia"), the Government of the Republic of the Philippines (hereinafter called "the Philippines"), the Government of the Republic of Singapore (hereinafter called "Singapore"), the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand (hereinafter called "Thailand") (which are collectively called "the Parties"), desirous of having an ASEAN Optical Fibre Submarine Cable Network (hereinafter called "the Network") linking Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand, hereby confirm the construction of the Network on the basis of the following understanding:

- 1. The Network shall be configured as shown in Annex I.
- 2. The Network shall be capable of interconnection and shall provide for terminal and transit traffic and diversity of operation, security and restoration of such traffic.
- 3. The tentative Ready For Service dates of the various segments of the Network are as shown in Annex II.
- 4. All Parties shall extend their fullest cooperation to achieve the above objectives.

 Thailand's statement is attached in Annex III.
- 5. Non-ASEAN telecommunication entities or carriers may be permitted to invest or purchase capacity on an ownership, Indefeasible Right of User basis or any other basis in the segment of the Network under terms and conditions to be determined by the terminal parties concerned.



With reference to the Memorandum of Understanding on the Construction of the ASEAN Optical Fibre Submarine Cable Network, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that I have been authorized and empowered to sign, on behalf of the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand, the said Memorandum of Understanding.

In so expressing the consent of the Government of the Kingdom of
Thailand to be bound, the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand attaches a
reservation to the said signature as follows:

Taking into account of the original aim of the ASEAN Submarine Cable Network and of the spirit of cooperation among member countries, by which the link between Thailand and the Philippines was planned in 1978, but not yet implemented up to now, in becoming Party to this MOU. Thailand reserves the right to subsequently negotiate with interested ASEAN Countries with a view to directly linking Songkhla station Charlee II with the Philippines or Brunei Darussalam.
