## INSTRUMENT OF ACCEPTANCE

WHEREAS, the Protocol on the Special Arrangement for Sensitive and Highly Sensitive Products, signed at Singapore on 30 September 1999;

AND WHEREAS, paragraph 1, Article 9 provides that this Protocol shall enter into force upon the deposit of the Instruments of Ratification or Acceptance by all Signatory Governments with the Secretary-General of ASEAN;

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, having considered the Protocol, hereby confirms and accepts the same and undertakes to perform and carry out all the stipulations contained therein;

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, being duly authorised thereto by the Government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, has signed and sealed this Instrument of Acceptance.
