WHEREAS Protocol – "ASEAN Scheme of Compulsory Motor Vehicle Insurance" was signed in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on 8th day of April 2001 by the Governments of Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand, and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam, Member States of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (hereinafter referred to as "Contracting Parties");

AND WHEREAS Article 15 of the said Protocol provides that the Protocol is subjected to ratification or acceptance by the Contracting Parties

NOW THEREFORE the Government of the Republic of Singapore having considered the said Protocol does hereby ratify the same.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, this Instrument of Ratification is signed by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Singapore on this 29 day of August 2002.

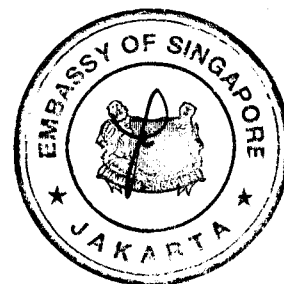
