INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

WHEREAS the ASEAN Convention on Counter Terrorism (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") was adopted and signed by the 10 ASEAN Leaders at the ASEAN Summit on Thirteenth Day of January in the year Two Thousand and Seven in Cebu, Philippines;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Malaysia had signed the said Convention on the Thirteenth Day of January in the year Two Thousand and Seven in Cebu, Philippines;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Malaysia in accordance with Article XXI of the Convention has decided to ratify the said Convention;

NOW THEREFORE the Government of Malaysia having considered the said Convention, hereby ratifies the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out the stipulations therein contained subject to the following declarations:

Article 2

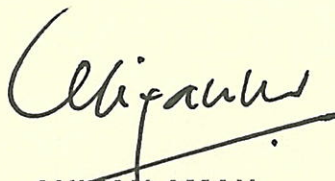
The Government of Malaysia pursuant to paragraph 2 Article II of the Convention, declares that, in application of the Convention to the Government of Malaysia, the following Conventions and Protocols shall deemed not to be included in paragraph 1 Article II, until the said Conventions and Protocols enters into force for the Government of Malaysia:

- i. Paragraph (1)(e) – Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material, adopted in Vienna on 26 October 1979;
- ii. Paragraph (1)(g) – Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Acts Against the Safety of Maritime Navigation, done at Rome on 10 March 1988;
- iii. Paragraph (1)(h) – Protocol for the Suppression of Unlawful Acts Against the Safety of Fixed Platforms Located on the Continental Shelf, done at Rome on 10 March 1988;
- iv. Paragraph (1)(k) – International Convention for the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism, adopted in New York on 13 April 2005;
- v. Paragraph (1)(i) – Amendment to the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material, done at Vienna on 8 July 2005;
- vi. Paragraph (1)(m) – Protocol of 2005 to the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Acts Against the Safety of Maritime Navigation, done at London on 14 October 2005; and
- vii. Paragraph (1)(n) – Protocol of 2005 to the Protocol for the Suppression of Unlawful Acts Against the Safety of Fixed Platforms Located on the Continental Shelf, done at London on 14 October 2005.
