MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN

THE ASEAN-US AUTOMATED DATA EXCHANGE

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations

(hereinafter referred to as "ASEAN") of the one part and the

Government of the United States of America (hereinafter

referred to as "the United States") of the other part,

## HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- In consideration of the mutual desire of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and the United States of America to implement fully an automated data exchange of foreign trade and tariff data, the United States, acting through the Agency for International Development, will provide a technical assistance program to those ASEAN members who require it. The furnishing of such assistance will be subject to mutually agreed upon side letters of detailed arrangements to be signed by participating countries and the United States.
- This assistance program will seek to enable participating members to develop systems and procedures which support full participation in the automated data exchange. This foreign trade and tariff data exchange underscores the continuing cooperation between ASEAN and the United States, and the mutual benefits derived from such projects.

For purposes of implementing this Memorandum of Understanding, the Government of the United States of America will be represented by the Agency for International Development. This Memorandum of Understanding shall become effective upon ASEAN's concurrence, and shall remain in force unless terminated by either party.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned, being duly authorised thereto, by their respective Governments have signed the present Memorandum of Understanding.
